<p>Tlingit today live a modern life in Southeast Alaska but carry on many of their traditions.</p>	<p>They made clothing and blankets from shredded bark.</p>
<p>Tall poles carved and painted with human and animal figures telling the history of a family.</p>	<p>wood and salmon</p>
<p>Several families from the same clan lived together in one house.</p>	<p>Ceremonial feast that lasted several days and showed the wealth of some tribes of the Northwest.</p>

They were able to catch so much salmon in the warm months that they were able to smoke the surplus and eat it all year.
