<p>There were few trees because the region was so dry so Southwest tribes had to build houses of sticks, stones and adobe.</p>	<p>Clay formed into sun-dried bricks and used as building material.</p>
<p>They dug clay and formed it into containers. They fired their pottery with coal and used them to store food.</p>	<p>a special event at which people gather to express important beliefs</p>
<p>They believed they were caretakers of their land and if the land was healthy, they would have good harvests. They prayed and held ceremonies.</p>	<p>region: low, flat desert with areas of high plateaus, has some rivers fed from mountain snow climate: very dry, little rain</p>
<p>A way of supplying water to an area of land</p>	<p>One of several groups known as Pueblo Indians. They lived in present-day Arizona around 1350.</p>
<p>Small plateaus with steep sides and flat tops</p>	<p>They used irrigation to direct water from rivers to their fields. They planted corn deep in the ground and planted crops in fields that flooded in the spring.</p>
