



| | adobe — A type of clay |
| • | Built home on top of mesas to be protected from attack |
| | • <u>mesas</u> : Small plateaus with steep sides and flat tops |
| • | Many were farmers; had to find way to water crops due to dryness. Used <u>irrigation</u> |
| | • <u>Irrigation</u> : Way of supplying water to crops with streams, ditches, pipes. |
| • | Also planted corn deep in ground so roots would get moisture |
