WHAT IS A SENTENCE?

A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought.


A sentence states an idea. A sentence is complete if it can stand alone and make sense. Every sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a punctuation mark.

Sentences

We planned Diane's birthday party. Sabrina and Peter made the decorations.

Not Sentences

Served fruit and snacks. Sabrina and others.
